




Level Setting: Information Security

The Infosec Professional Says:

The study and practice of protecting information. The main goal of information security is to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information.



In your opinion, which is the most important information security concept with respect to State Data Systems?




Level Setting: Privacy

The Infosec Professional Says:

A person's right to have control of his or her own personal data. The person has the right to specify how that identifiable data is collected, used, and shared.

Privacy vs. Security




Figure 2: Relationship Between Information Security and Privacy

Figure 2 shows a non-proportional representation of the relationship between the privacy and security domains.
